Georgia FSC Hosts Successful 2006 Eastern Synchronized Team Skating Sectional Championships



The Georgia Figure Skating Club hosted the 2006 Eastern Synchronized Skating Sectional Championships at The Arena at Gwinnett Center on January 27 - 28. Almost 1,600 skaters, representing 101 teams from up and down the East Coast, competed in levels based on age and ability.

"We've got just about every hotel room in Gwinnett County full," said Rob Lichtefeld, president of the Georgia Figure Skating Club.

As coach buses ferried competitors to the arena, girls popped out wearing matching warmups, pulling identical rolling suitcases, their names embroidered on each. Their hair was pulled up into identical buns, held in place by matching bands and lacquered with hair spray. The theatrical aura was further enhanced by the eye glitter, bronzer, lipstick, lip gloss, and blush adorning their excited

faces.

Teams, ranging in size from eight to 20 members and in ages from five to 67, performed intricate patterns in circles, in parallel and perpendicular lines, in small groups and all together.

Created in 1954 as intermission entertainment at University of Michigan hockey games, synchronized skating is now the fastest growing segment of the sport. According to one parent, many skaters prefer team to individual skating because "instead of competing against your friends, you're competing with them."

The top four teams in the Juvenile, Intermediate, Novice, Junior, Senior, Collegiate, Adult and Masters levels will progress to the February national championships in Grand Rapids, MI.


